

Challenges

ELRA continues with the control program for Eurasian \ Milfoil (EWM). Thus far, our efforts appear to be workin Emily. However, more EWM was evident this year in M which will require treatment.

Other Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) remain a concern zebra mussels, starry stonewort and curly leaf pondwee being found in other lakes. All those who enjoy our lake river need to be vigilant in ensuring that transport and introduction to our waters is not taking place. Eurasian Water Milfoil Update

ELRA engaged the services of PLM for treatment of Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) again in 2018. Surveys were completed of both Emily and Mary (see maps posted on ELRA web site).

No areas were found requiring treatment on Emily. However, the ELRA Board plans to proceed with caution and will be checking within 30 days to see if EWM has re-appeared and may just have not been visible yet due to this year's growing and weather conditions. EWM control requires a long-term continuous commitment.

Zebra Mussel Inspections

ELRA participates with Crow Wing County for the testing of veligers (larvae form of the zebra mussel). **Doug Tarasar** takes samples which are tested to determine if the veligers are present. This is an "early warning system" for the presence of ze mussels. The Crow Wing County AIS program pays for test. Thus far no veligers have been detected.

Remember to check your docks, boats, lifts, etc. for any presence of zebra mussels. Should you find any report to the Minnesota DNR at (218-203-4354) and to ELRA at elra@emilylakes.org.

8.8 acres of treatment area was proposed by PLM on Mary. This is an increase from last year's level. The Board has given PLM the go-ahead to treat the areas as shown on the map posted on ELRA's web site.
